Local trips in the past 4 weeks



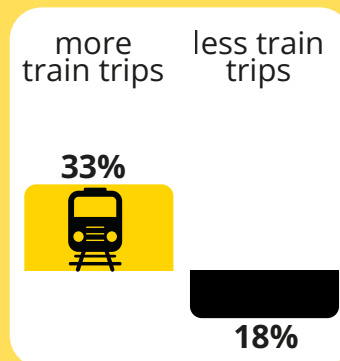
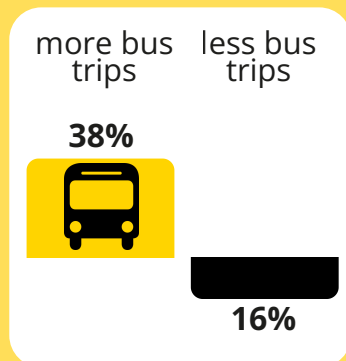
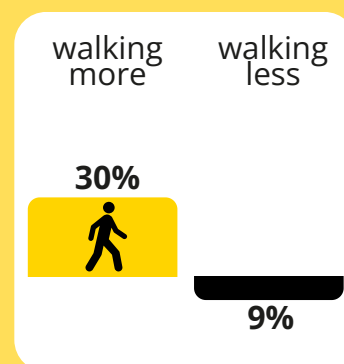
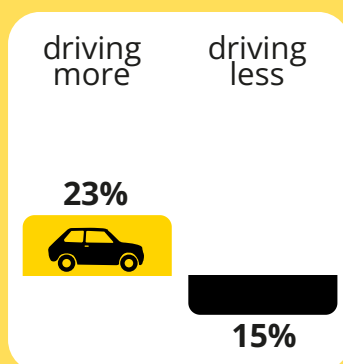
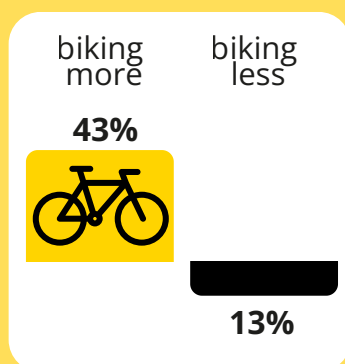
69% enjoy bike trips

About the 2025 AA Local Transport Survey

Data is taken from the AA Local Transport Survey, conducted in February 2025. The survey response rate is 5.6% (n=7568 out of 135,244 Members invited). The margin of error is 1% at the 95% confidence interval. Results are weighted to reflect the demographics of the AA Membership.

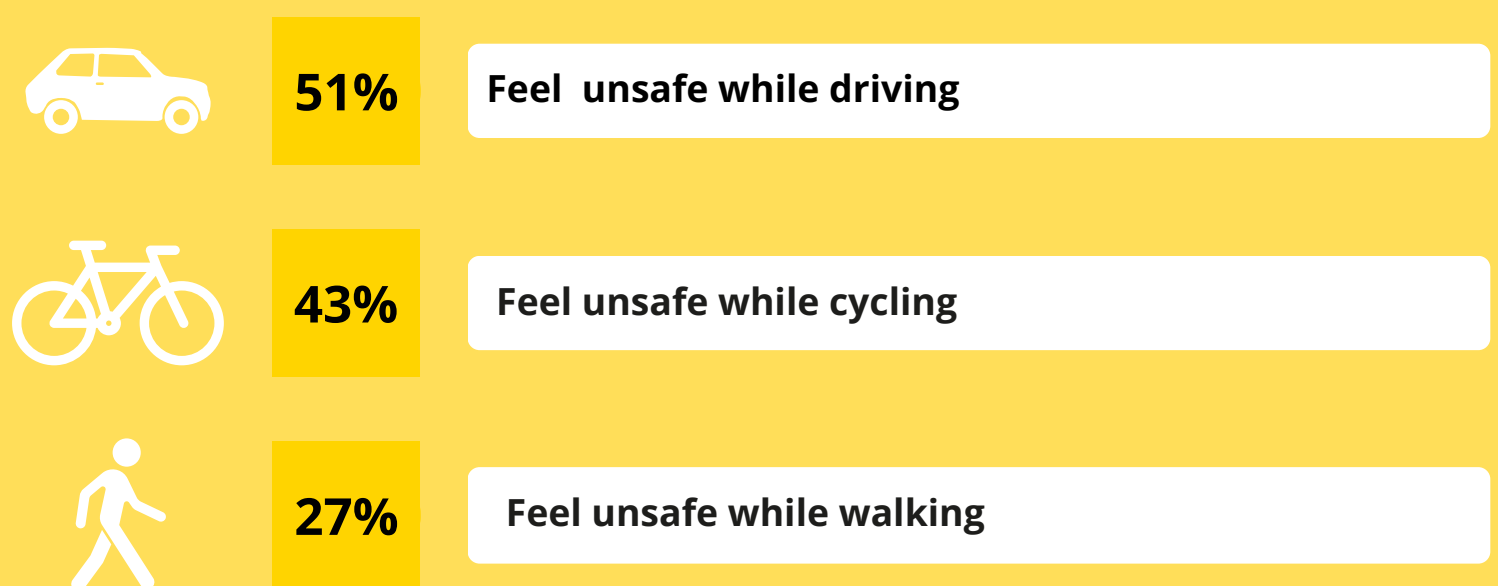

6 out of 10 want **driving** infrastructure prioritised for improvements

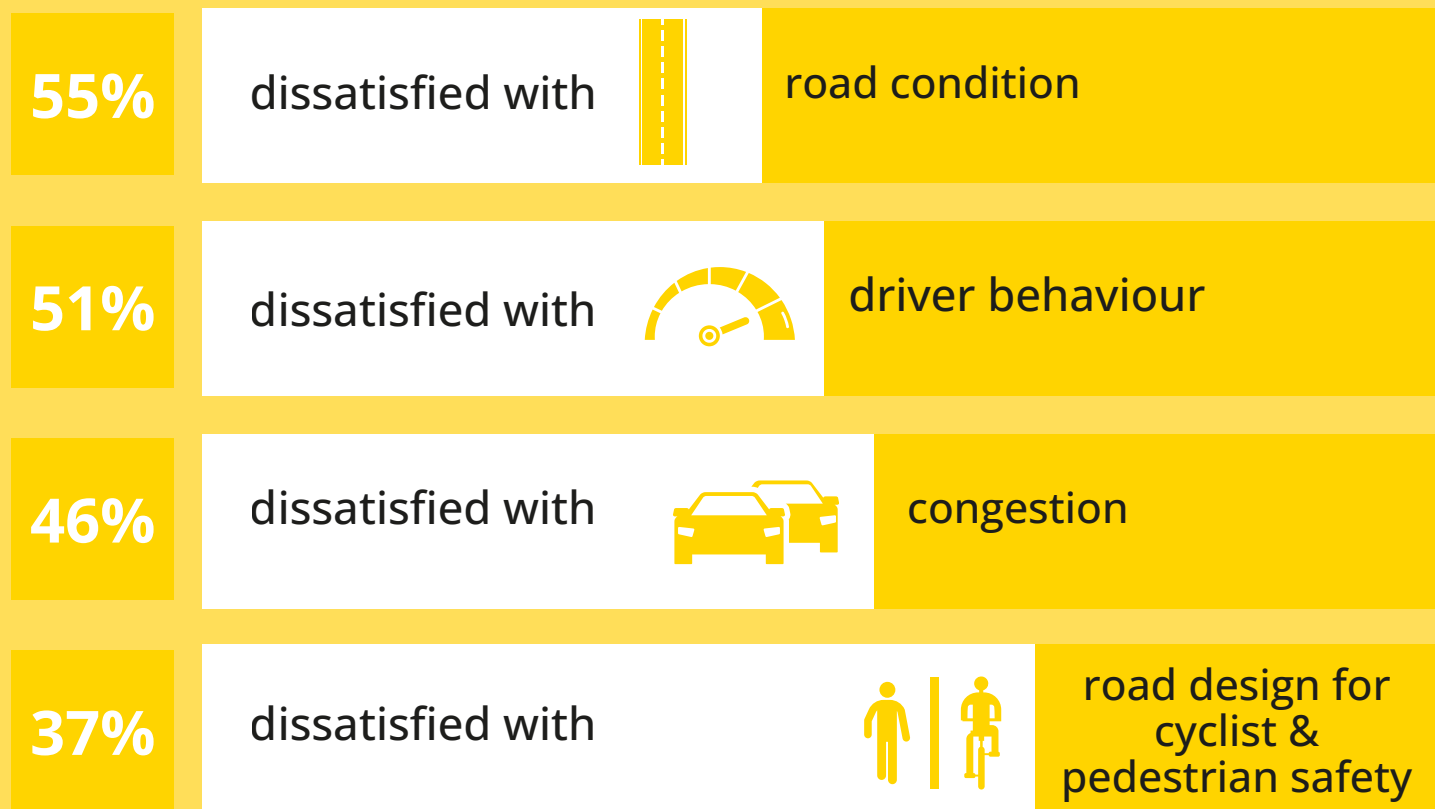


4 out of 10 want **public transport** infrastructure prioritised for improvements
