



Driving dominates, but other transport modes plays important role

Members are increasing use of other transport modes more than car use




About the 2025 AA Local Transport Survey


Data is taken from the AA Local Transport Survey, conducted in February 2025. The survey response rate is 5.6% (n=7568 out of 135,244 Members invited). The margin of error is 1% at the 95% confidence interval. Results are weighted to reflect the demographics of the AA Membership.



4 out of 10 Members said local transport upgrades in the past year improved their quality of life



Concern about unsafe drivers on the roads is high



6 out of 10 want driving infrastructure prioritised for improvements



4 out of 10 want public transport infrastructure prioritised for improvements
